Embroidery on Robes

It is Christmas Time and I have embroiderers that are having issues with placement for monograms on robes. I know that it appears to be an issue, but it really is very simple.

1. Lay it flat on the table and fold the one flap over the other as if you were wearing it.
2. Make sure the collar is folded down into position.
3. Now you are going to place your monogram in the same position as you would a left chest embroidery.
4. Measure down from the neck edge of the shoulder to where the point of the center of the monogram should be again as if it were on a jacket.
5. Measure over from the center of your robe which will be the center of the collar down the front of the robe and over to where the center of your left chest embroidery would be on a jacket. Place pins in the robe to mark your line.
6. If your collar is large, you may have to move the monogram over or down a small amount.
7. If the collar is huge, consider placing the monogram on the collar.

After you have it marked, try it on someone to see if your line is straight. If it is terry, do not use chalk on it to mark it. Use straight pins. The chalk is very hard to remove on Terry. Soap may work, but it all depends on the blend or the color of the robe. I have found that this method works out very well.
