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INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR FONT FILES

There are several formats for the **Medieval Font File** and the **Borders Files**. These files **DO NOT** have any **Underlay Stitching, Pull Comp, Locks or Trims!**

You will need to apply all of these in your software. Sometimes these commands do not hold when you go from one software program to another.

For Pulse Users- Versions 11, 12, 2009, 14, 15, and 16

I have a Medieval.fon that is a font file that you can install into Pulse and use it just like any of your other Pulse fonts, you can download that font file and install it into the Pulse software.

I have included an article called **Installing A Font File Into The Pulse Software**. Print out that article so you will know how to install the Medieval.fon font file.

For Version 10 I have included the .PXF files of all of the letters. You will open up your Pulse program and open up the PXF files from the DVD and save them in your design folder in Pulse or wherever you have our designs files saved on your hard drive.

For Version 9 I have included the .POF files of all of the letters. You will open up your Pulse program and open up the .POF files from the website and save them in your design folder in Pulse or wherever you have our designs files saved on your hard drive.

For other programs you will have to open the .DST files from within your program. You have 2 files; one is called Font file and the other one is your Borders.

The left-side, center and right-side letters are all in the same file for each alphabet letter.

Open up the files for each alphabet letter that you need.

In the Wilcom system, the file will open up as an EMB file. You will add your Pull Comp, Underlay, Trims and Locks.

In the Design Shop system it will open up as a .DST file. You will have to convert it to a wire frame to add your Pull Comp and Underlay or do any other editing.

Borders

There are .pxf and .pof files for the Pulse users and .dst files for all of the other software programs.

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
